

Bethany Brand, Ph.D. is a Professor of Psychology and an expert in trauma disorders. She is the Director of the Clinical Focus Program at Towson University. Dr. Brand conducts research in five areas: treating dissociative disorders (TOP DD studies); distinguishing dissociative disorders from malingering; training clinicians about trauma; investigating the trauma vs. fantasy model of dissociation; and assessing the accuracy of textbooks' information about trauma. She has been honored with the endowed Martha E. Mitten Professorship as well as teaching, research and clinical awards including the Outstanding Contribution to the Science of Trauma Psychology, Psychology Teacher of the Year in Maryland, the Cornelia B. Wilbur Award, the ISSTD Presidential Award, the Pierre Janet Award, and the Morton Prince Award. She has published more than 100 articles and chapters, and has two books in press about treating individuals with dissociative disorders. In addition to assessing and treating patients in her private practice, Dr. Brand serves as a forensic expert in trauma-related cases including federal and capital (i.e., death penalty) cases.

Elizabeth Power, M.Ed. is a best-selling author, educator, and consultant who helps people reduce the time, trauma, and cost of healing. Her project, The Trauma Informed Academy, provides non-pathologizing, inclusive trauma-informed training integrated with Emotional Intelligence for audiences from survivors to clinicians. Diagnosed with what used to be called MPD in 1990, and having chosen a developmental learning approach to her healing, she has become a thought leader in the field of trauma-responsivity (at the personal and organizational level).
